

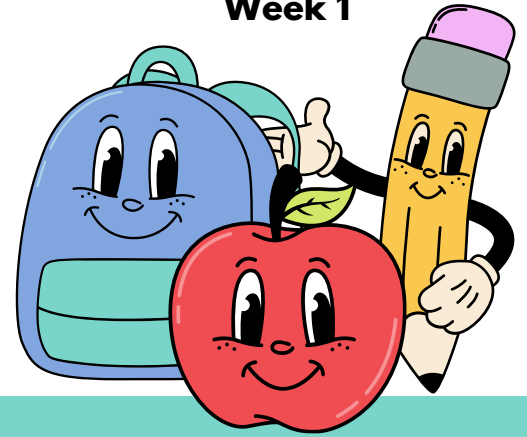

We have had concerns raised recently regarding the use of Whatsapp amongst pupils at Laurel Lane, particularly the use of group chats.

What parents and carers should know

Minimum age: WhatsApp's age rating is 13

Group chats: Children can be added to group chats without their consent. These groups can grow quickly and may include unkind messages, inappropriate content, or pressure to respond.

Sharing images and messages: Anything sent—photos, videos, voice notes—can be forwarded instantly. Once shared, it's difficult to control where it goes.

Late-night messaging: Constant notifications can affect sleep and wellbeing, especially if children feel they must reply straight away.

How to support your child

Talk openly about how they use messaging apps and who they communicate with.

Check privacy settings together and show them how to block or report unwanted contact.

Encourage them to come to you or another trusted adult if something online makes them uncomfortable.

Remind them that they do not have to join group chats or respond to messages that feel unkind or overwhelming.

If you have any concerns about your child's online safety, please contact the school. We're here to help and can offer guidance or signpost further support.
