Key Information

Our Eco-Warriors have entered Laurel Lane into the national Big Walk and Wheel competition. From 16th March to 27th March, we encourage all families to walk, scoot, or cycle to school as often as possible. If this is not feasible, please consider parking a little further away and walking the final part of the journey. Taking part not only helps us compete for national prizes, but the Laurel Lane class with the highest number of active journeys will also win a special prize of their own! This initiative also links closely to recent concerns about vehicles blocking the entrance to the St Martin's car park and at times even our own barriers. These blockages prevent cars from entering the site and pose a serious safety risk, as this is the only access point for emergency vehicles and must be kept clear at all times. We have also received reports of several near misses involving vehicles and pedestrians. In some cases, these incidents have led to heated exchanges between adults, including the use of inappropriate language in front of children. This behaviour is unacceptable and does not reflect the respectful environment we strive to maintain as a school community.

Emotional wellbeing

Emotional wellbeing is about children feeling safe, valued, and able to understand and manage their feelings. When pupils have strong emotional wellbeing, they are more confident, form positive friendships, and are better able to learn. In school we support this through daily routines, trusted adults, and lessons that help children recognise emotions, build resilience, and talk about worries. Every class has a calm corner and are encouraged to use the vocabulary linked to Zones of Regulation.

Families can strengthen children's emotional wellbeing through small, everyday habits. Regular check-ins about their day help children name feelings and feel heard. Predictable routines around meals, homework, and bedtime give children a sense of safety and calm. Encouraging play, outdoor time, and creative activities helps them unwind and express themselves. When children face worries or big emotions, staying patient, listening without rushing to fix things, and reassuring them that all feelings are valid can build confidence and resilience.

Letting school know about any changes at home also helps us work together to support your child consistently.
