On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> October, Vaccination UK will be visiting Laurel Lane to administer the nasal flu vaccinations to the children whose parents have signed up for them. If you have agreed for your child to be vaccinated but they refuse on the day, they will not be forced. If they do decline, you will be informed.

Next Friday, 17<sup>th</sup> October, we are opening our doors once again for Parents to take part in our “Book Look”. Please come at 8.30 if you would like to view your child’s books. This is a chance to see how hard your children have been working.

Also, next Friday, Braiswick Photography will be in to take individual and sibling photos. Please make sure that your child comes to school in full uniform.

## SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

If your child will be absent due to sickness, please inform us no later than 8.45am. If you do not receive an answer on the telephone, please leave a message stating their full name and class and the reason for their absence. Please advise the nature of their illness, not just unwell. Please ensure that you inform the school office using the above details, not just by informing your child’s class teacher – teachers are very busy and do not always have time to inform the office before the end of registration and this could result in you receiving an absence message.

Please obtain **medical or dental appointments** outside of school hours for both your children and yourself. We do appreciate that this can be difficult, but please bear in mind that if children miss any time in school, this may have an impact on their education.

## SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION:

We have been informed by members of the community that there was an incident observed during collection after clubs, which involved one of our families behaving cruelly towards a cat, causing it intentional harm and distress. As role models to our children, it is important that we are demonstrating kindness and compassion towards both other people and animals. This incident caused upset for those pupils who witnessed it and will not be tolerated.

# Pupils with Allergies

According to The NHS Foundation Trust, 1-2 children will have a food allergy in the average sized classroom. If a parent has an allergy such as Hayfever, Asthma, Eczema or a food allergy, their children are 50% more likely to develop an allergy too. This number increases to 70% if both parents have an allergy.

## Food Allergies

The most common foods that can cause allergies are peanuts and tree nuts (such as almonds, walnuts, cashews), cows milk, eggs, soy (including, but not limited to tofu, edamame beans, soy milk), hummus (contains sesame), and shellfish. Chocolate spread sometimes contains hazelnuts – please check the label.

Please avoid putting these items in your child's lunchbox. Even though another child is not likely to eat the contents of another child's lunchbox, in some cases, even being in the same room as the item that they are allergic to can cause a severe reaction.

## Asthma

If your child has been diagnosed with Asthma, a potentially life-threatening condition, hopefully you will have advised us and supplied an inhaler prescribed to your child to be kept in school. **We would like to remind you of the importance of carrying an inhaler with you wherever your child goes.**

## Anaphalaxis

This is another potentially life-threatening condition for which Adrenaline Auto-Injectors (AAI) or EpiPens are prescribed along with Cetirizine and, in some cases, a Salbutamol inhaler. If your child is diagnosed with Anaphylaxis, we will require two EpiPens to be kept in school, one bottle of liquid antihistamine (generally Citirizine is prescribed) and, if required an inhaler. **We would also remind you of the importance of carrying these items with your child at all times.**

If your child has been diagnosed with any of the allergies listed above, Mrs Knight may be contacting you to request a copy of their Asthma or Allergy plan.
