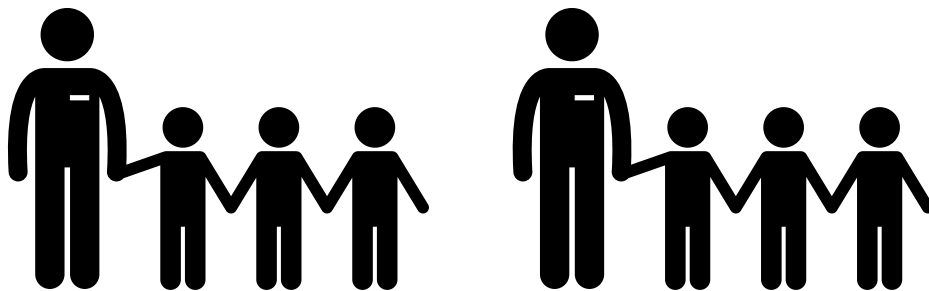

Consent Curriculum

Throughout the year, pupils at Laurel Lane participate in our age-appropriate consent curriculum. The curriculum is designed to help children understand their own boundaries, respect the boundaries of others, and communicate clearly and confidently in everyday situations.

Through stories, discussion, and guided activities, students learn that consent means asking for permission, listening to the answer, and respecting it—whether it's about sharing personal space, joining a game, or giving a hug. Lessons emphasise that everyone has the right to feel safe and comfortable, and that it's okay to say "no" or change their mind. Importantly, the curriculum is taught in a developmentally appropriate way, focusing on respect, empathy, and healthy relationships rather than complex or adult concepts. It also supports key social skills such as active listening, kindness, and problem-solving.

By teaching consent early, we are helping students build strong foundations for positive relationships, self-confidence, and mutual respect—skills that will support them both inside and outside the classroom.
