This Saturday we will be privileged to witness the crowning of King Charles III and the celebrations taking place over the weekend.

Queen Elizabeth II died in September 22 and the throne passed immediately and without ceremony to the heir, Charles, the former Prince of Wales. It has taken until May 2023 to ensure that all of the necessary arrangements are in place for the official crowning ceremony which will take place at Westminster Abbey.

There will be lots of celebrations over the new few days, plus those that have already happened, such as the parties that we had in class today. It is such a shame that the weather let us down after the good weather we have had all week but we all enjoyed our indoor parties.




